A Capes Sokol attorney presented oral argument in the Eighth Circuit Court of Appeals in <u>Kansas City</u> <u>Taxi Cab Drivers Association, LLC, et al. v. City of Kansas City, Missouri.</u> Such matter seeks to declare §76-73 of the Kansas City, Missouri taxicab Ordinances unconstitutional and in violation of the Equal Protection and Due Process clauses of the United States Constitution.

Section 76-73, among other things, seeks to:

- (a) reduce the number of outstanding taxicab permits from 600 to 500;
- (b) provide for automatic, annual renewals of taxicab permits to existing taxicab permit holders, even if the number of outstanding taxicab permits exceeds 500 at the time of renewal; and
- (c) requires new taxicab permit applicants to, minimally, apply for ten taxicab permits.
